## Example Questions

- ☐ b Back up drive D:. Convert both the new drive and drive D: to dynamic disks. Create a volume set of the two drives. Restore the files to the new volume set.
- ☐ c Convert drive D: into a basic disk and extend the partition to the new drive.
- ☐ d Back up the home folder and delete it. Mount the new drive as a folder on drive D: named the same as the old home folder. Restore the user's files.
- ☐ e Move the home folder to the new drive. Create a shortcut on drive D: to the new drive.
